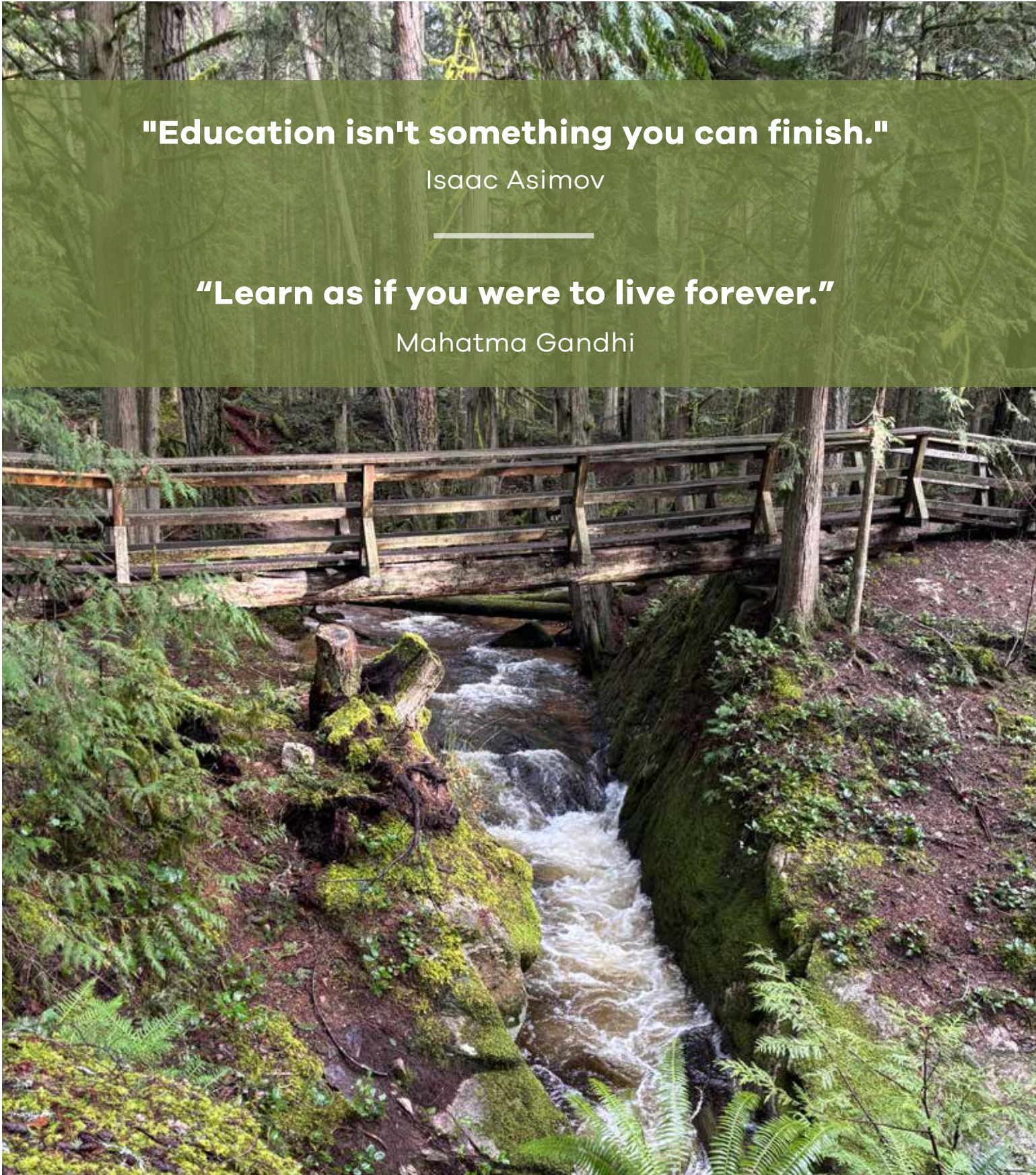

FINDING HOME:

WE WON'T KEEP YOU IN SUSPENSE.

Over the past five years since our 2020 publication of *The Challenge of Change*, marking our first 20 years, an underlying concern has been our search for a permanent home. During the COVID 19 pandemic, public venues shut down completely and we delivered our courses via ZOOM. Since then, we have resumed in-person classes at a variety of venues while a dedicated subcommittee has looked for a place we could call home. We had hopes that a permanent base might be found at the CapU kálax-ay campus, which was, in fact, the birthplace of ElderCollege as part of the Capilano College Continuing Studies program. Many of our courses have made good use of the CapU facilities, particularly our Microscopy course which relied on the well-equipped Science Lab and the Genealogy course which used the Computer lab. Sadly, the closure of the Sechelt campus has put paid to our hope for a permanent home base at CapU although its closure has been a major loss for the whole Sunshine Coast community.

Fortunately, we have found rental space at the Sechelt Arts Centre and now have our name over the rear door, new paint on the walls, a working air purifier and a place to call home, for at least the next year. We are close to the Sechelt Seniors Activity Center with whom we share interests and anticipate future collaborations. The refurbished room at the rear of the Arts Centre is large enough to accommodate our Board and Program Committee meetings and will also house some of our smaller courses. While the rental outlay is more expensive than what we are used to, we can now cover the extra cost due to a second important development in the last two years: a bequest left us by a longtime ElderCollege devotee—Joe Cleo Peters. Thanks to Joe's generosity, SCEC can contemplate a more financially secure future and we are discussing ways in which we can honour his memory.

On December 3, 2024, the combined Committees of the Executive Board and the Program Committee met in a Planning Session led by April Struthers, Consultant and Owner of Wit Works Ltd. Our aim was to build understanding and consensus among all members of the Society with a view to the key priorities for the future of SCEC. Consensus was achieved and our goals and priorities established under Struther's skilled guidance.



COURSE DELIVERY

Since 2020 and the constrictions of the Covid 19 pandemic, we have tested out hybrid courses in new venues, including the Gibsons Public Market and Christenson Village, expanding our accessibility over the coast; in the process, we have discovered the limitations of current technology and the shortcomings of online

delivery. Feedback has told us that most of our participants prefer in-person classes because of the social interaction. In a few cases, where the presenter can't physically visit the coast, for example, online delivery has solved the problem. We remain flexible when it comes to modes of course delivery.

CHANGING VENUES

At the Gibsons Public Market we have used the Coastal Room for lecture/discussion style courses, such as “The Life and Times of the Pacific Salmon.” The popular cooking courses, like “Blue Zone Cooking,” have made use of the GPM kitchen which allows participants to sample the course product. No complaints there.

At Christenson Village, “Adventures in Travel” has allowed mobility restricted residents to enjoy the travel experiences of four different explorers, all from the comfort of their armchairs. We are currently trying out this course platform at Silverstone in West Sechelt.

Another aspect of our outreach has been our effort to participate in reconciliation with the shíshálh Nation through courses such as “Governance Sharing” which delves into the real history of colonization and engages shíshálh witnesses to provide first-hand testimony. As well, a free, four-part lecture series called “Welcome to my swyia” was delivered by hereditary chief hiwus Calvin Craigan. Approximately 150 people gathered in the shíshálh longhouse for four days over two weekends to hear Craigan’s stories about the

history, culture and struggles of the shíshálh people before and since encountering European settlers. The series was delivered in the autumn of 2022 and again in 2024, garnering positive feedback from audiences.

Another important outreach event was the 2024 Clifford Smith Memorial Lecture (CSML), “Indigenous Law and Conversations Across Generations” delivered by University of Victoria Professor, Dr. Val Napoleon. In the Faculty of Law at UVic, Dr. Napoleon co-founded a degree program—the first of its kind in Canada.

Whereas previous CSMLectures were held in the Chatlech High School auditorium, in collaboration with School District 46, our 2024 lecture, delivered by Howard White from Harbour Publishing,

celebrating “A Thousand Books in 50 Years: Reflections of a Raincoast Chronicler,” was moved to the Raven’s Cry Theatre which was filled to capacity for White’s entertaining and informative presentation. The increased capacity and central location, as well as the marquee advertising, have helped to fix the CSML in the public mind.

Special funding from Crowe Mackay LLP and the Sechelt Rotary Club in 2024 enabled us to deliver an additional free public lecture: “Yes, We Can Fix the Housing Crisis” presented by Dr. Alexandra Flynn, Associate Professor at the University of British Columbia and Director of the Housing Research Collaborative. This was another “sold-out” free event. We hope to offer more free public events in future, an added benefit from our bequest.

The central location and larger capacity have made the Raven’s Cry the venue of choice for our annual Clifford Smith Memorial Lecture series. Of special significance for today’s media-boggled public was our 2025 CSML talk: “Disinformation in Canada,” delivered by Dr. Ahmed Al-Rawi, Associate Professor of News, Social Media and Public Communications at Simon Fraser University and Director of its Disinformation Project since 2019. These lectures are free and open to all members of the public.

We have just had confirmation that our 2026 CSML talk will address the topic of Artificial Intelligence, “Friend or Foe,” to be delivered by Stephanie Dick on October 3, 2026 at the Raven’s Cry Theatre. AI is an issue of current concern which reflects the ongoing efforts of SCEC to grapple with contemporary problems. Dr. Dick is Assistant Professor in the School of Communications at Simon Fraser University.

All in all, the friendly cooperation we have encountered at Gibsons Public Market, Christenson Village, the shíshálh Longhouse and Raven’s Cry Theatre has enabled SCEC to enhance our exposure and strengthen our place in the culture of the Sunshine Coast community.

GENDER BALANCE AND MORE

Thanks to our in-house statistician, Michael Bradley, we have numbers which indicate that more women enrol in SCEC courses than do men. To address this imbalance, we have tried to design programs that might have special appeal for men, such as Al Clyde's "Artisans Crawl," a course that visits the workshops of skilled artisans devoted to motorcycle/machine maintenance, airplane construction, miniature train operation and other hands-on skills. Al also delivers a course in "Timber Processing on the Sunshine Coast" which fills up immediately, mostly with men, proving that our direction on gender balancing is having positive results.

Over the past five years, we have discovered that smaller "boutique" courses (limited to 15 or 20 people) such as "Watercolour Painting" and "Geology of Thormanby Island" are highly popular but so are the perennial favorites such as "Law for Seniors" and Keith Maxwell's history presentations. Our goal has been to provide a range of subject

matter from the arts and sciences, to the literary ("Preview of the Festival of the Written Arts" for example) and the practical ("Understanding Your Septic System"), from the philosophical ("Let There Be Light") to hands-on activity ("Design Your Own Garden") in order to stimulate and satisfy our participants.

GENDER BALANCE AND MORE

We conduct follow-up surveys to find out what works and what doesn't. The responses so far have been extremely positive. Our volunteer presenters are knowledgeable and enthusiastic. Without their generosity of spirit and time, we couldn't function. They have our sincere gratitude. They have made Sunshine Coast ElderCollege a going concern in the culture of the community. We are lucky here on the coast to attract a host of well-educated retirees who still have a wealth of knowledge and expertise to share with a cohort of contemporaries eager to learn. It's proven to be a formula for success.

To show our gratitude to all those presenters, facilitators, Board and Program Committee members who have made SCEC a success over the years, we are planning a celebration on June 6 of 2026 to acknowledge and thank them. Our combined belief that third age education is a vital resource for the cohort aged 55plus has meant that SCEC is now a solid and permanent pillar of the Sunshine Coast community. Many, many thanks to you all.



Canada and International Security

25 YEARS AND BEYOND

The 2024 edition of the Vital Signs report commissioned by the SC Community Foundation informed us that the median age on the coast is 56 and the fastest growing population on the coast is 75 plus.

The burgeoning population of elders suggests that the contribution of SCEC to enriching the community's learning experience is increasingly relevant. The success of public events like Dr. Al-Rawi's talk on "Disinformation in Canada" indicate a desire to keep abreast of societal change not only for the older age groups but for the community at large.

Courses like "The Age of Disclosure - Can we Handle the Truth" presented by Ray Kostaschuk indicate an ever-increasing interest amongst our age group in new and emerging topics. Meanwhile, presentations like Christine Giancarlo's anthropology-themed course, "Making Sense of Human Nature," allow us to look back on human

development with new information and fresh eyes. "Music as Medicine" challenges old assumptions and offers new insight into the benefits of a universally enjoyed experience. To date, our Spring 2026 enrolment is the second highest in our history at 481 participants. We have 18 courses planned for Fall 2026, our most ambitious offering yet. It's clear that our first 25 years of Third Age education have met with a success which bodes well for the next 25.

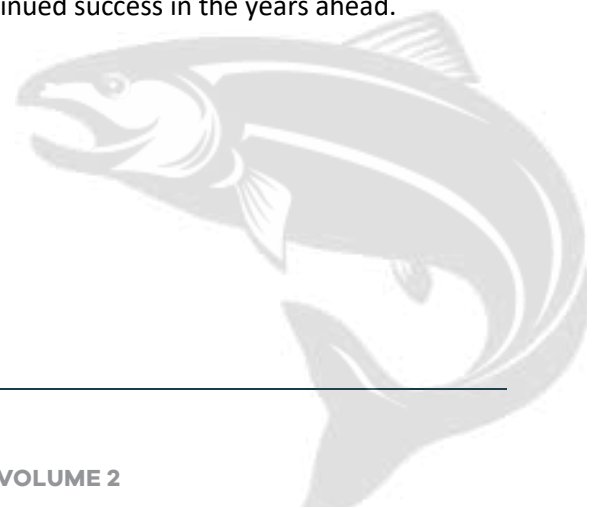
