## Free Annual Clifford Smith Memorial Lecture 2020

Dr. Erwin Diener

### The Immune System: Its Protective and Destructive Nature

Our body's individuality is guarded by complex cellular and molecular interactions, which govern the distinction between "self" and "foreign." This lecture centers on understanding these interactions; showing how they provide immunity from potentially fatal invasions by bacteria and viruses and from cancer cells whose molecular structures deviate from "self." Through knowledge of the subtle dynamics that underlie the distinction between "self" and "not-self" we shall comprehend the body's vulnerability to autoimmune disease.

Dr. Erwin Diener, a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada, is an internationally celebrated scientist. His accomplishments are so numerous and significant that they cannot be done justice here. In the words of a colleague Diener is "a world prominent immunologist. He represents a scientist of extraordinary ability whose career has made a major impact on the discipline and who has received world-wide acclaim for his findings. He is also recognized internationally as founding Chairman of one of the most exciting immunology departments in Canada."

## Astrogeomorphology

Geomorphology is the science concerned with the forms of the land surface and the processes that create them.
